

Tour de Pologne returns to Eurosport!

Poland's biggest cycling race, the Tour de Pologne UCI World Tour, will return to Eurosport next year. Lang Team and Eurosport announced their cooperation at a press conference held at the TVN Warner Bros. Discovery headquarters in Warsaw yesterday.

From next season, the Tour de Pologne, Tour de Pologne Women and ORLEN Nations Grand Prix will be broadcast on Eurosport, known as the "home of cycling". The announcement was made during a special conference attended by **Czesław Lang**, General Director of the Lang Team, and **Łukasz Fijałkowski**, Operations Director of Eurosport, as well as guests, Eurosport commentators and journalists.

After a four-year break, the biggest cycling race in this part of Europe will once again be broadcast on Eurosport. Thanks to this partnership, the 82nd edition of the Tour de Pologne and future races will be broadcast in 65 countries across Europe and around the world, as well as on the Max platform and other partners, ensuring even greater international promotion for Poland.

"We all missed the Tour de Pologne on Eurosport. Apart from the undeniable sporting value, we want to promote and showcase Poland. I'm very happy that 65 nations will be able to see Poland and the changes that are happening here. Eurosport will undoubtedly be an excellent platform to showcase our country and, of course, the best sporting emotions," said **Czesław Lang**, General Director of the Lang Team and the Tour de Pologne.

"Unfortunately, we won't be able to ride through the Karkonosze Mountains as planned due to flooding. However, we will include this beautiful area in the future. Next year, we'll include the Beskids, the Tatras in Silesia and Małopolska. All of them will be very interesting and challenging," adds Lang.

It's important to note that the partnership between Lang Team and Eurosport for the next five consecutive seasons includes not only the Tour de Pologne, but also the Tour de Pologne Women and the ORLEN Nations Grand Prix, all of which will be broadcast on Eurosport.

Following the success of this year's Tour de Pologne Women, the race has been promoted to the top tier of Union Cycliste Internationale events. Eurosport's coverage will further enhance the prestige of this fast-growing race, as well as the ORLEN Nations Grand Prix for under-23 riders.

"The ORLEN Nations Grand Prix is very important for me. It's right to focus on the World Tour, but there won't be a strong World Tour without junior events. Without them, sponsors won't get visibility and there will be a big gap and a lack of cyclists," explained Czesław Lang.

The cooperation with Eurosport is a big step forward for all the races.

"In recent years, we've covered 100% of the women's WorldTour and in 2025, with the Tour de Pologne on Eurosport, we'll probably cover 100% of the men's WorldTour as well. We give visibility to road cycling, track cycling, mountain biking and more, following 300 days of racing every year. We're the only broadcaster to offer so much cycling content, with over 1,000 events and 4,000 hours of coverage attracting more than 110 million viewers a year in 65 countries," said **Łukasz Fijałkowski**, Operations Director at Eurosport.

Next year, the 82nd Tour de Pologne will take place from 4 to 10 August, the ORLEN Nations Grand Prix from 14 to 18 May, and the Tour de Pologne Women will start two days after the Tour de Pologne finishes and end on 14 August.
