Route revealed for the 82nd edition of the Tour de Pologne!

From 4 to 10 August, the Polish race will wind through stunning landscapes, delivering thrilling sporting moments.

Warsaw, 13 June 2025 – The official route of the 82nd edition of the Tour de Pologne was unveiled today during a special broadcast on TVP Sport. This prestigious stage race, which is part of the UCI WorldTour calendar, will take place from 4 to 10 August, featuring seven exciting race days through some of the country's most spectacular regions.

Starting in Wrocław, the capital of Lower Silesia, the race will conclude in Wieliczka with a decisive individual time trial that will keep viewers on the edge of their seats until the very end. Once again, race director Czesław Lang and the Lang Team have designed a technical and diverse course to showcase the talents of the world's top riders.

Stages and profiles:

- **Stage 1 | Wrocław – Legnica**
Designed for sprinters, this flat stage features three LOTTO intermediate sprints in Kąty Wrocławskie, Środa Śląska and Polkowice, as well as a King of the Mountains (KOM) sprint in Prochowice. At the end of the day, the first general classification leader will be crowned and will wear the ORLEN Yellow Jersey.
- **Stage 2 | Hotel Gołębiowski Karpacz – Orlinek (Karpacz)**
This stage is ideal for climbers and finishes atop the iconic Orlinek, where Alberto Contador and Tim Wellens have previously won. The route includes the challenging ascents of Kowarska and Średnica, with intermediate sprints in Czarny Bór, Chełmsko Śląskie and Karpacz.
- **Stage 3: Wałbrzych – Wałbrzych**
This fully mountainous stage in Lower Silesia features the climbs of Walim and Niedźwiedzica, a KOM in Rzecznica and a special DPD prize in Jedlina-Zdrój. This is one of the most challenging stages of the entire race.
- **Stage 4 | Rybnik – Cieszyn**
This stage, organised in collaboration with the Archducal Castle Brewery Cieszyn, will test riders' endurance with a LOTTO sprint in Jaworze, the climbs of Przegibek, Orle Gniazdo and Salmopol, and two special prizes: DrWITT and '35 Years of the IMPEL Group'. The finale will feature spectacular circuits through the historic centre of Cieszyn, where Peter Sagan and Zdenek Stybar have previously won.
- **Stage 5 | Katowice – Zakopane**
This is a true marathon of over 200 km through the heart of the Tatra Mountains, where there have been memorable victories by Jonas Vingegaard, Tim Wellens, Thor Hushovd and Peter Sagan. It includes a LOTTO sprint in Wilamowice, where João Almeida and Matej Mohorič competed against each other two years ago, as well as challenging climbs such as Kocierz and Krowiarki. There will also be special prizes from Decathlon and DPD. This stage marks the race's entry into the Małopolska region, where the grand finale will take place.

- **Stage 6 | BUKOVINA Resort – Bukowina Tatrzańska**
This is the queen stage, starting from the resort and finishing in Bukowina Tatrzańska. Riders will tackle the brutal 'walls' of Harnaś and Bukovina in Rzepiska and Gliczarów, as well as an intermediate LOTTO sprint in Szaflary and a special Soudal prize. Earlier in the day, the ORLEN Tour de Pologne Amatorów, a race for amateur cyclists, will be held on the same route.
- **Stage 7 | Wieliczka – Individual Time Trial (12.5 km)**
The Tour concludes with a technical 12.5 km time trial near the Wieliczka Salt Mine, which starts with a challenging uphill section. This final test will determine the winner of the ORLEN Yellow Jersey in a dramatic showdown. Past winners at this location include Jacky Durand and Raimondas Rumšas.

Jerseys and classifications

The ORLEN Yellow Jersey is the most coveted prize in the Tour de Pologne. It has previously been worn by champions such as Michał Kwiatkowski, Rafał Majka, Remco Evenepoel and Jonas Vingegaard, who has won the Tour de France twice. Other classifications include: The LOTTO Active Riders Classification, the Best Climber's Jersey, the Team Classification (Decathlon) and the ORLEN VITAY Jersey for the best Polish rider.

Teams and media coverage

The 2025 edition will once again feature the world's top teams, including UAE Team Emirates-XRG, Visma | Lease a Bike, Red Bull-BORA-hansgrohe, Soudal-Quick Step, Lidl-Trek, Decathlon AG2R La Mondiale and the Polish national team. TVP Sport will broadcast the race live, while Eurosport and the MAX streaming platform will bring the action to over 65 countries, showcasing Polish cycling, landscapes, and event partners to a global audience.

Tour de Pologne Women and Junior

Cycling will continue in the days following the men's race. On 12 August, the Tour de Pologne Women will begin — a three-day stage race held in the Lublin region. At the same time, young talents will compete in the Tour de Pologne Junior, with stage finishes in Legnica (4 August), Karpacz (5 August) and Cieszyn (7 August).
